**Approval of Minutes March 26, 2013:**

**F. Gavigan made a motion to approve the March 26, 2013 meeting minutes with one typographical correction. P. McGovern seconded the motion. All were in favor; the March 26, 2013 meeting minutes were approved as amended.**

**Open to Public:**

There were no members of the public present.

**Old Business:**1. GreenFest request for feedback

J. Floyd reported that B. Sageser had forwarded a request for feedback on the GreenFest from Glorianne Robbi via e-mail. She asked members that attended to forward feedback to her which she will compile and forward to FOSPC.

It was noted by M. Van Horn that the Mayor may be interested in reissuing the 1976 Blue Book for the 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Hunterdon County. She inquired if the Historic Preservation Committee would like to take an active role in this or form a sub-committee.

2. Sidewalk color choice resubmitted

J. Floyd reported that B. Sageser resubmitted the color choice that was submitted last year.

**New Business:**1. Planning for programs

Bus tours and walking tours were mentioned as possible programs. It was suggested a program on "researching your historic homes" be held. This type of program was held in the past; an expert came in to speak. K. Cannelongo suggested a program where residents are made aware if they live in a historic district and are advised that any projects are subject to review and the legalities

involved. She explained that the historic district locations can be found online; perhaps this information can be put in the VIP. It was noted that there aren't any tax credits for private homeowners. Utilizing pictures at a possible presentation was suggested; there are pictures from the Quick collection or the County available.

## 2. Planning for HCCH Expo table and staffing June 9

J. Floyd reported that the Hunterdon County Cultural and Heritage Expo is on June 9<sup>th</sup>. P. Sullivan, P. McGovern and M. Van Horn can attend; J. Davidson will check his availability.

## 3. Hunterdon Land Trust "Treasure Hunterdon"

Dave Harding announced that the Hunterdon Land Trust is hosting "Treasure Hunterdon" on June 29<sup>th</sup>, a fundraising event for the land trust where different sites will be visited. Sites include the Lingbergh House, book bindery, Headquarters Farm and other locations.

## 4. Invoice from Chris Pickel

There is \$1600 past due to Chris Pickel; these invoice will be paid for with funds from the Township, not the grant.

**P. Sullivan made a motion to approve payment of this bill if the work has been done; F. Gavigan seconded it. All were in favor; the motion passed.**

**F. Gavigan motioned to approve the bill for \$78.81 from Staples; M. Van Horn seconded it. All were in favor; the motion passed.**
