Hello everyone. Thank you for coming out on a very HOT Sunday and sprucing up Amwell Lake with the East Amwell Environmental Commission. Thank you, too, to Juanita Hummell for providing information on the migratory birds that frequent Amwell Lake. It was an informative lesson and reminder as to why we need to keep it clean. Even if we don't net a lot of "trash", cleanups like this are a great form of citizen science and advocacy.

We netted 4 bags of trash - all commingled as any "recyclable" material was far too degraded to be considered as such. This was picked up by the County on Monday.

Interesting things found were an old hunting stand. Also removed was a large refrigeration component (?) as well as lots of cigarette butts, wipes (ew) bottles, a needle and pieces of tarp.

We had two intrepid explorers who went above and beyond - Warren and BILL - who emerged from the woods after bushwacking their way through prickers. They ultimately circled the entire Amwell Lake and then some! I hope you guys submerged yourselves in bactine for a few hours and are all healed. Thank you!!

Birds seen/heard were: Canada Geese, mourning doves, a GREAT blue heron:), American goldfinch (1), field sparrow, red winged blackbirds and prairie warblers. We also witnessed a snapping turtle lay her eggies!

We are happy to report that the neighboring property has been keeping their area clean since the first cleanup in March.

I will be in touch with new volunteer opportunities. In the meantime, attached are some pics from Sunday and our 2nd East Amwell Environmental Commission newsletter.
