

## CERTAIN VOTING INFORMATION REGARDING 2020 ELECTION

Except for those who are disabled and request access to an in-person voting device, **there will be no in-person voting in New Jersey in this November's election.**

You should have received a vote by mail ballot in the mail. If you did not, please contact the Hunterdon County Clerk's office to request a ballot.

To vote in this November's election, complete your vote by mail ballot in accordance with the instructions accompanying the ballot. For step-by-step guidance regarding how to complete the ballot, see the video posted on the Hunterdon County Clerk's website, at <https://www.co.hunterdon.nj.us/Election2020.htm>.

Once you complete your vote by mail ballot, there are four ways you can return the ballot:

**1. Mail.** You can place your vote by mail ballot in the postage paid envelope that came with the ballot, and deposit the ballot in the mail. To count, your ballot must be postmarked on or before November 3, 2020 and must be received by the Hunterdon County Board of Elections by 8pm on November 10, 2020.

**2. Deliver to Board of Elections.** You can bring your vote by mail ballot to the Hunterdon County Board of Elections, at 71 Main Street, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, in Flemington, prior to 8pm on November 3, 2020.

You may bring ballots of up to three other people, provided the Bearer Section on the left-front side of the return envelope for each ballot is completed in accordance with the instructions.

**3. Deposit in a Secure Drop Box.** You can deposit your ballot in one of 12 secure drop boxes located throughout Hunterdon County. You must do so by 8pm on November 3, 2020. All these drop boxes are monitored by video surveillance.

You may bring ballots of up to three other people to the drop box, provided the Bearer Section on the left-front side of the return envelope for each ballot is completed in accordance with the instructions.

**4. East Amwell Municipal Building on November 3<sup>rd</sup>.** You can bring your completed vote by mail ballot, but not any other person's ballot, to the East Amwell Township municipal building on election day, November 3, 2020, between the hours of 6am and 8pm. When you arrive at the municipal building, you will sign the poll book, the same as if you were voting at a machine. Your ballot will then be deposited into a secure drop box.

If you come to the municipal building on November 3<sup>rd</sup> without your vote by mail ballot, you will be permitted to complete a provisional ballot, which will look essentially the same as a vote by mail ballot, except you will be required to complete an affirmation statement. However, provisional ballots will not be counted any earlier than November 11<sup>th</sup>.

Ballots deposited into a secured drop box pursuant to 3 or 4 above will be delivered to the Board of Elections by a member of the Sheriff's Department.
